An Chomhairle to consider the report and recommendation of the Director of Services, Infrastructure Development, dated 23rd May 2022, following public consultation, on the proposed Upper Glanmire Pedestrian Safety Scheme pursuant to Section 38 of the Road Traffic Act, 1994, as amended by Section 46 of the Public Transport Regulation Act, 2009.

8.2 **PART 8 PLANNING PROPOSAL ELIZABETH FORT OUTDOOR PUBLIC SPACES SCHEME**

In accordance with the provisions of Section 179 (4) (a) of the Planning and Development Act 2000 (as amended), An Chomhairle to consider the proposed Elizabeth Fort Outdoor Public Spaces Scheme and the attached report of the Director of Strategic & Economic Development thereon, as required under Section 179 (3) of the Planning and Development Act, 2000 (as amended) and, if so decided to adopt the following Resolution:-
